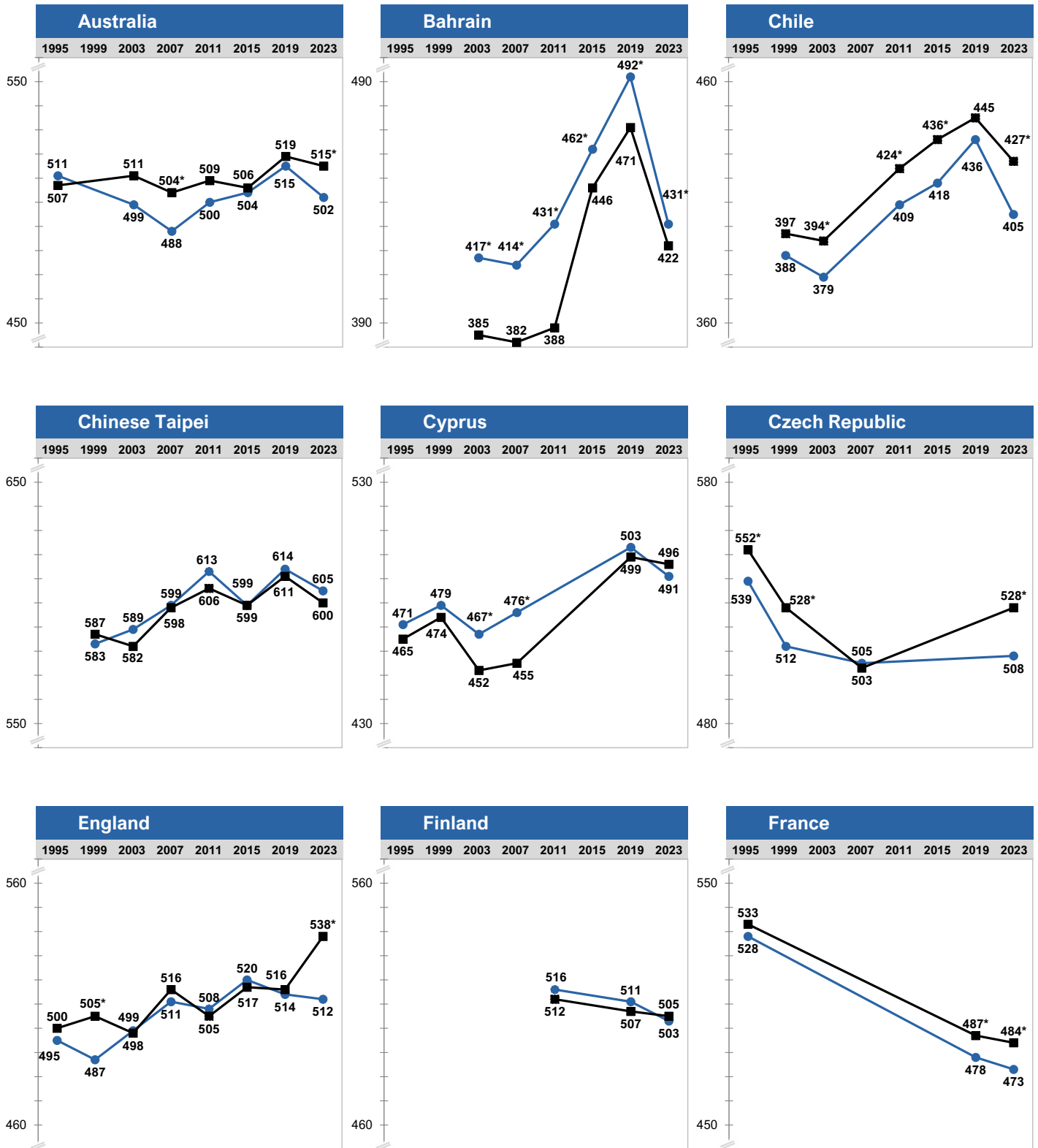


Exhibit 1.2.11: Trend Plots of Average Mathematics Achievement for Girls and Boys

Girls ● Boys ■ * Average significantly higher than other gender ($p < 0.05$)



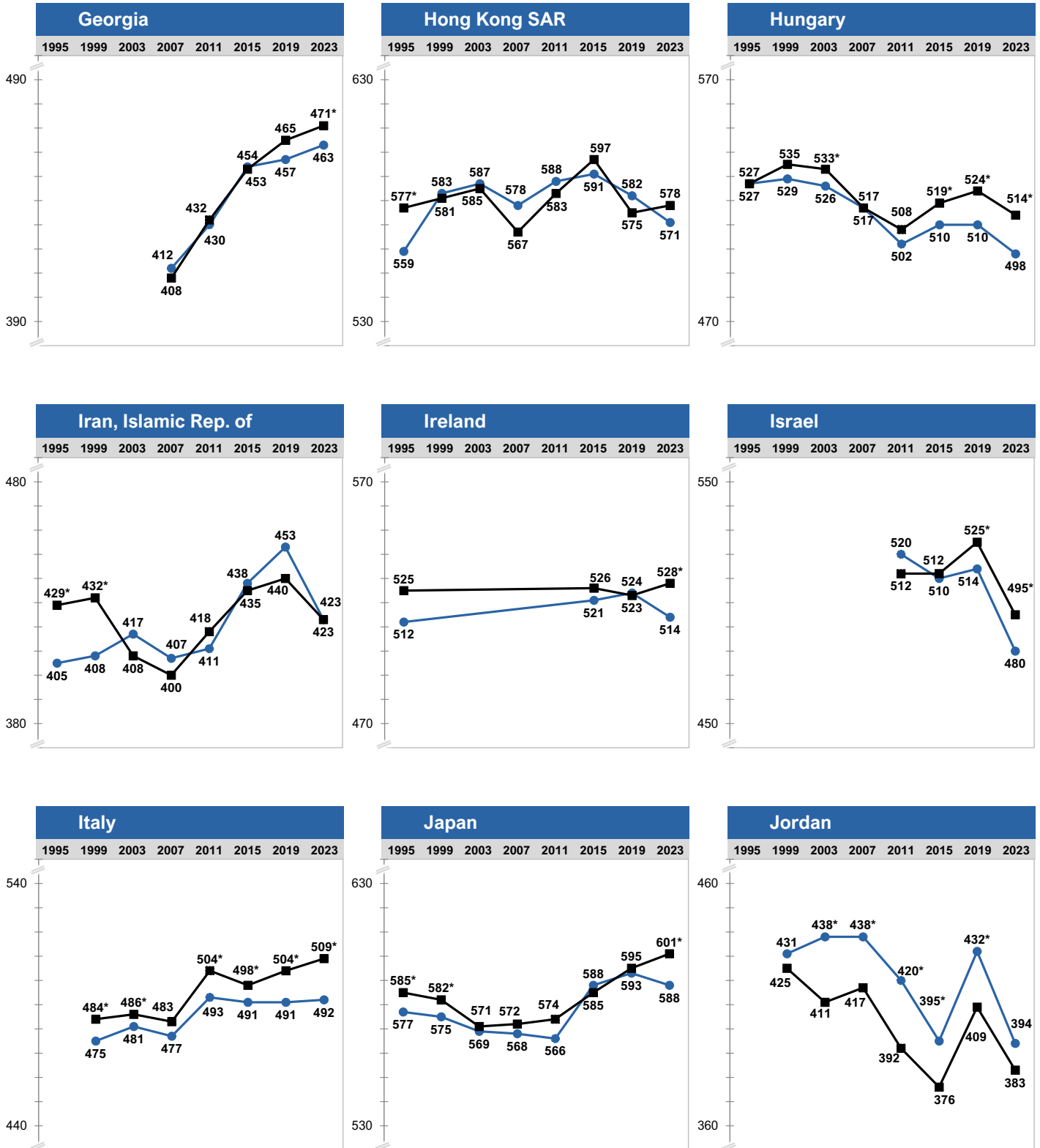

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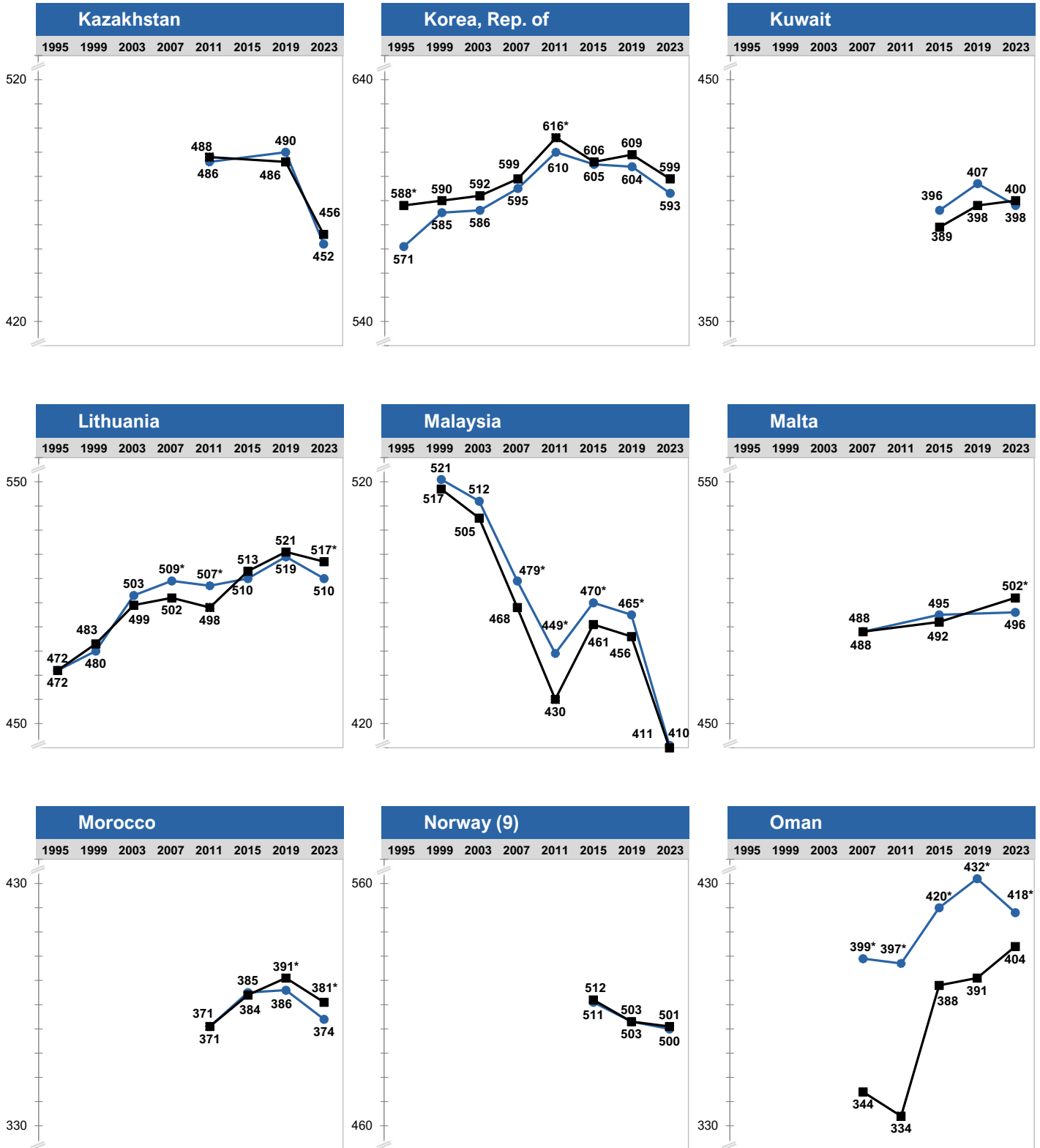

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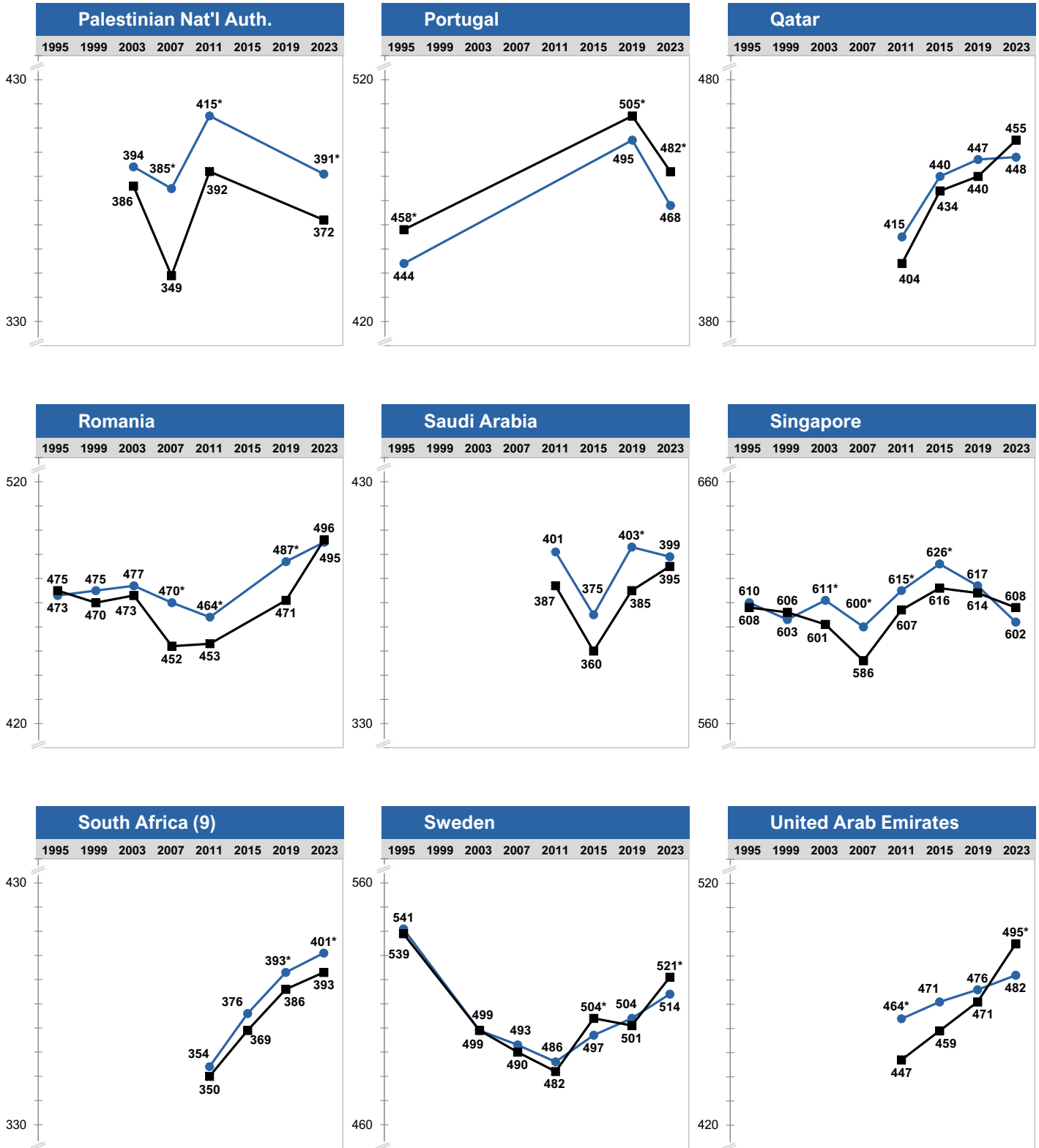

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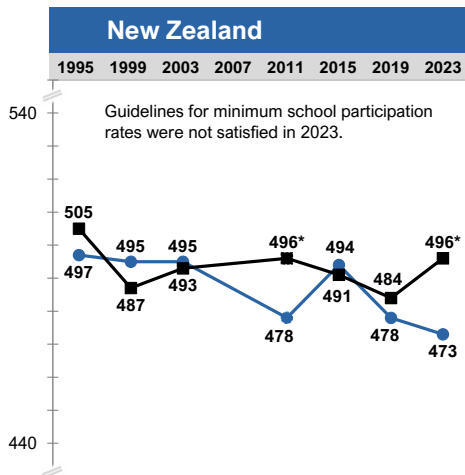
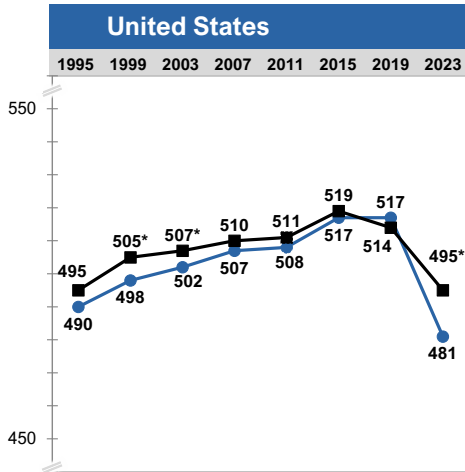

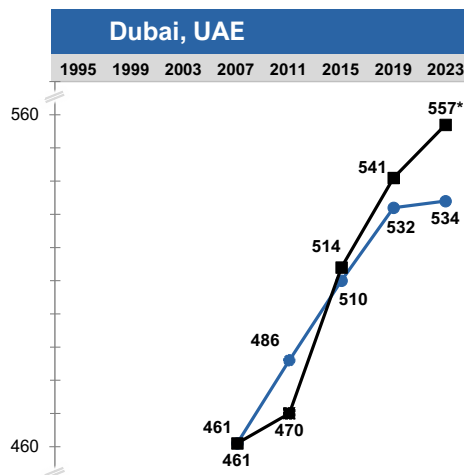
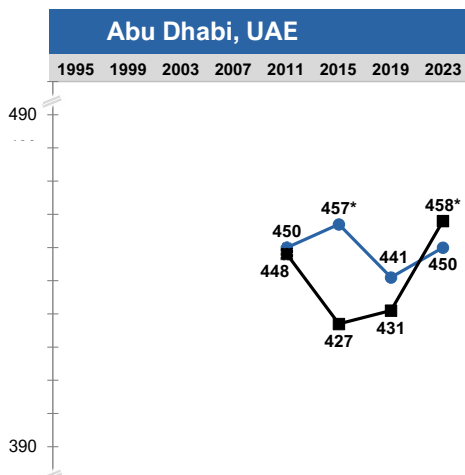
